Threads exists to help unchurched people become radical "love God, love others" Christ followers.

We believe the Bible is the Word of God, with every word and thought inspired by God. It is the sufficient and final authority for our faith and lifestyle.

(II Timothy 3:16, II Peter 1:20-21)

We believe one God has eternally existed in three persons: the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit. The three persons are co-equal and form one God. God is all knowing, everywhere present, all powerful, holy, good, and just. He is the Creator of all that exists.

(Genesis 1:1, 26-27, 3:22; Psalm 90:2; Matthew 28:19; I Peter 1:2; II Corinthians 13:14)

We believe God the Father is the head of the Trinity. He initiates in the relationship within the Trinity. He also provides for and protects His children. The Father is creation's architect and authored the plan of salvation.

(Matthew 3:17; John 5:37; Galatians 3:26; Ephesians 1:3-6; Hebrews 12:9)

We believe Jesus is the Son of God. He is co-equal with the Father. He became a man (without diminishing His deity) by birth to a virgin named Mary. Jesus lived a sinless human life and offered Himself as the perfect sacrifice for the sins of all people by dying on a cross.

He arose from the dead after three days to demonstrate His power over sin and death. Jesus ascended to Heaven's glory and serves us as our great high priest. Jesus will return from heaven to finish establishing His Kingdom.

We believe the Holy Spirit is co-equal with the Father and the Son of God. He is present in the world to make humanity aware of their need for Jesus Christ. He also lives in every Christian from the moment of salvation. He provides the Christian with power for living, understanding of spiritual truth, and guidance in doing what is right. He gives every believer a spiritual gift or gifts when they invite Jesus to live under his control daily.

We believe that Jesus sacrificed His own life in place of ours. All who believe on Him are forgiven, saved, and no longer under the condemnation of eternal death.

We believe through the life, death and resurrection of Jesus Christ, God has established the Church. It is a single worshipping community permanently gathered together in God's presence. However, it appears in the form of local

congregations. The Church is designed to gather for worship, for teaching the Word, for prayer, for fellowship between believers, and for meeting the needs of one another. The very heart of the Church's mission is to make disciples wherever we are going.

We believe people were created to live forever. All people have rebelled against God and face a deserved death penalty. Non-believers will exist eternally separated from God by sin in hell. Believers will exist eternally with God in heaven through forgiveness and salvation.
